


# Build your game

## Bottoms Up



### Step 1

Make the glasses:


To make the glasses, first print out the sheets with the glass designs from the 'Pieces' file (pages 1 and 2, one sided).



### Step 2


You will also need:

Scissors;  
Double sided tape or glue;  
Craft knife;  
Acetate (not compulsory, but very cool :)



### Step 3

Start by cutting along the dotted line rectangle.



### Step 4

Next fold along all the solid lines as shown in the picture.



### Step 5

Fold the sides as you see on the picture and carefully cut out the glass shape, outlined with a dotted line, so you end up with four different panels with a glass shape cut out of all of them.




### Step 6

Open up the cut out booklet fully and turn it over, so the picture of the glass faces down. Apply double sided tape to the entire surface of all four sides of the booklet, carefully going around all four glass cutouts.




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
### Step 7

If you have acetate (we have used thin biodegradable acetate), cut two pieces slightly smaller than one panel of the booklet and apply them to the two middle panels. If you don't have acetate, continue with step 8.



### Step 8

Fold the two outside panels in to obtain one booklet with just two sides. If you have added acetate, it will be trapped inside the newly created windows and look like glass.



### Step 9

Apply a strip of double sided tape to the top and bottom of one panel of the glass and fold the two sides together to obtain a glass that is open on the right hand side and sealed closed on all other sides.



### Step 10

**Make the ingredients:**  
To make the ingredients, first print out the ingredients sheets from the 'Pieces' file, which are double sided. Print page 4 on the back of page 3 and page 6 on the back of page 4.



### Step 11

Once the ingredients are printed out, just cut them out. You should end up with strips of paper with colours and ingredients' names on one side and text on the other. The text should be pale gray and not visible from the front.



### Step 12

**Make the garnishes:**  
You will find the garnishes on page 1 of the Pieces file of the game. To make them, simply cut out all the garnishes and then make a cut through each one as shown in the picture. That is how you will slot the garnishes on your cocktail glasses during the game.

Your game is ready :)

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# Make the Box

Your game has a lovely little box, designed just for it. If you would like to make it, print out the pages from the Box file for the game and follow the instructions below. For best results, use thicker paper if your printer can take it.



Start by printing the file and cutting out the overall shape of the box. This box uses the full width of the A4 sheet you print. Make sure the printer is set to print at 100% size, rather than 'shrink to fit'. This way the box will be the appropriate size for the pieces. Your printer probably won't print to the edges, but that's not a problem at all. Simply extend the lines from the design to the edges, using a pencil or just cut and fold by eye. Cut out the overall shape by cutting along the dotted line on the bottom of the design.

Next cut along the four short dotted lines in the four corners of the design and fold along all the uninterrupted lines.

This next step is not compulsory. You can skip it if you like, but we are suggesting it because it will add some extra support and durability to your box. What we are doing is to insert four pieces of card into the sides of the box to make it sturdier. As this box is larger than the others in our collection, it has fewer layers of the paper itself and the card helps balance that. So, if you would like to do this step, here is what you need to do:



Use any card that is not too thick. Thin to medium card will do best, but even thick paper will work. It is best to use white card or paper as this will not affect the colour of the box.


Cut four strips of the card that are roughly 30x203mm. To make sure you have the right size, simply measure the inside of the side of the box. The strip of card needs to be a little smaller than the side itself, so it fits comfortably and doesn't alter the shape of the box.

Use spray mount or another type of dry glue to glue the pieces of card to the sides of the box itself. Make sure they fit comfortably within the folds of the design. Finally, fold over and glue the two long sides as shown on picture 3 above.

If you chose not to do this step, simply skip the card and just fold over and glue the paper on the two long sides.



Next, fold the little ‘wings’ on both long sides of the box and then fold the sides in as shown on the first picture above. Then, add some spray mount or glue to the remaining sides, fold them over the little ‘wings’ and press to glue well. That’s it! One half of your box is ready :)



Repeat all the steps above with the other half of the box design and voilà! You have an adorable little box.
