

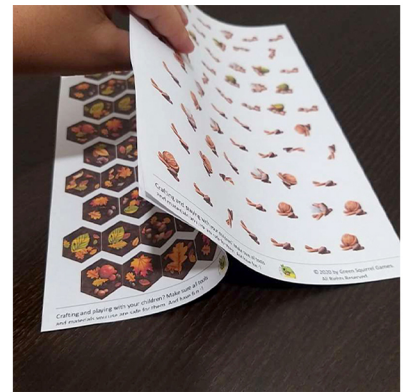
Craft Your Green Squirrel Game

Make the Tiles

Nuts is the first of our games that requires double sided tiles and a slightly unconventional box. Don't worry though, we have done everything we can to make the game super fun and easy to make. Follow this simple guide and you will make the game just as you see it in our photos in no time. Have fun, enjoy and let us know what you think :)



Start by printing all four sheets from the Game Pieces file for Nuts! on our website. No special printing is required. We have made our prototype using sheets of printing paper and basic settings for the printer. If you have access to higher quality, thicker paper that works well with your printer, use that. It will certainly add durability to your game.



To make the double sided tiles, you need to group pages 1 and 2 and pages 3 and 4 from the file.

Place pages 1 and 2 (one page with forest floor hexagonal pictures and one page with nuts) back to back, so they form a double sided A4 sheet with the Green Squirrel logo at the bottom on both sides. Glue the pages together using spray mount, prit stick or another type of dry glue, making sure the edges of the pages match.



Finally, simply cut out all the tiles, using the forest floor hexagons as a guide. You will end up with 140 different tiles, grouped in 4 different sets.

This is it, your game is ready to play :)



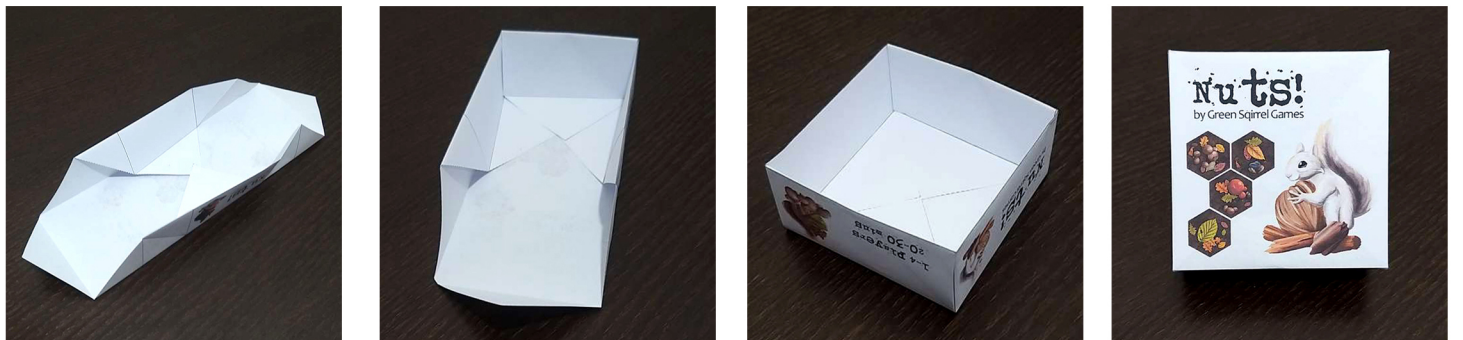
Make the Box

The box design we have come up with for Nuts! is a little unconventional, but it's super fun and makes storing and setting up the game really easy and convenient. You will effectively make 4 small boxes that will contain the four different sets of tiles for the game and one lid to keep them all together. Follow the instructions below and you will have an awesome box for Nuts! in no time.



Start by printing out all 3 sheets from the Box file for Nuts! Let's start with the lid:

1. Cut out the shape of the box by following the outside outline of the square.
2. Next, fold down all the lines on the design. Use a ruler to do the four small lines you can see on the last picture above. Align the ruler with the line and press the edge against it as you can see on the picture. For more detailed information, have a look at the Crafting instructions for Mirror Mirror on our website.



Starting with two opposite sides, fold the sides of the box in, following the folds you have already made along the design. Do the same with sides 3 and 4. You have a box lid :)

If you would like more detailed instructions on how to make the box lid, have a look at the Crafting file for Mirror Mirror on our website. The box lid for Mirror Mirror is made, using the same technique.



Repeat the exact same process with all four small box designs on the other two sheets you printed out. You will end up with four small boxes and one large box lid. Each small box has a squirrel design on the bottom. When you separate the tiles into their sets, place them in the corresponding box. You are ready to play and the adorable box lid will keep all the little boxes nice and snug together for storage.
