

# Build your game Baubles!



## Step 1

Make the Christmas Tree:  
Start by printing out all sheets from  
the 'Pieces' file.  
Use thicker paper  
if your printer can take it.



## Step 2

You will also need:  
Scissors;  
Double sided tape;  
Craft knife;  
Cardboard or foam board;



## Step 3

Cut out all 8 triangles of the  
Christmas tree, following the  
black lines.



## Step 4

Next you must cut out the slots,  
outlined in black on every triangle,  
using a craft knife. Every triangle has  
six slots that need to be cut out.



## Step 5

On the backs of all 8 triangles, place  
double sided tape along all three  
sides, making sure you don't cover  
any of the slots you just cut out.




## Step 6

For best results your Christmas tree  
should be mounted on thick card or  
even better - foam board. We have  
used foam board, 5mm thick. You  
will need 2 pieces at least  
44cm x 31cm

Crafting and playing with your children?  
Make sure all tools and materials are safe  
for them. And have fun :)




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
### Step 7

To make the tree you must stick one left and one right tree side to the card/foam board, making sure that they form a nice straight line at the bottom. You also need to leave space between the two sides, equal to the thickness of the card/foam board you have chosen. Our foam board is 5mm thick, so we have left a 5mm gap between the pieces.



### Step 8

When both sides are well placed, cut away all excess card/foam board. This is one side of this part of the tree. Reverse the triangle and repeat the process on the other side, so you end up with two identical sides.



### Step 9

Repeat steps 6 to 8 to make the other half of the tree. You should now have two large, identical triangles.



### Step 10

Pick a middle point on both triangles and carefully cut away everything from that point up to the top on one triangle and everything from that point down to the bottom on the other.



### Step 11

Simply slot the two pieces together and your tree is ready.



### Step 12

Make the Christmas Decorations: Cut out all Christmas decorations from the two sheets in the Pieces file.



### Step 13

Make a double fold on each decoration to create the hanging strip. To do that simply fold the white strip right at the top of the decoration and then make a second fold about 1mm above that.


Your Christmas tree and decorations are ready. If you would like to make our special little box to keep your decorations in, follow the Box making instructions.

# Make your Green Squirrel Free Print & Play game even better


## Make the box

This box is perfectly sized for the game tiles and provide an adorable and super convenient storage for the game. All you need are the two design sheets you downloaded from the website, a pair of scissors and a small dab of glue. The glue is not necessary, but it will help with the stability of the box. Here is how to make your box:


1. Print both sheets with the box designs.



2. Start with the lid. Cut out along the dotted lines. Fold along all uninterrupted lines. Follow step 3 to see how to easily make the small diagonal folds.



3. You can easily make the small diagonal folds on the design by placing a ruler along the line, placing your finger behind the paper and carefully folding against the ruler.



4. Turn the design over and fold two diagonal sides in as shown. Here you can add a small dab of glue in the middle where the two corners meet to secure them in place.




5. Fold one of the remaining sides in as shown. Be careful to fold the corners in as shown. These folds will create the shape, but also the stability of the box.




6. Fold the piece over to form the third wall. Secure the piece in the center with a dab of glue if you like.




7. Repeat the process with the opposite wall. The lid of your box is ready.




8. Make the box tray. The file for the box tray is slightly different, so the box can be deeper. The method of making the tray though is very similar. Cut out the shape along the dotted lines.



9. Fold along all the uninterrupted lines. You can easily make the small diagonal folds on the design by placing a ruler along the line, placing your finger behind the paper and carefully folding against the ruler.



10. Turn the design over and fold two diagonal sides in as shown. Here you can add a small dab of glue in the middle where the two corners meet to secure them in place.



11. Fold one of the remaining sides in as shown. Be careful to fold the corners in as shown. These folds will create the shape, but also the stability of the box.



12. Fold the piece over to form the third wall. Secure the piece in the center with a dab of glue if you like. Repeat the process with the other side to finish the tray.  
Your box is ready to be filled! Enjoy :)
